

Too often we as Christians have two lives: our church life, where we do our so-called ministry, and our secular life, where we earn our living. If we feel called into what we consider to be full-time ministry, the immediate assumption is that we are called to be the traditional Pastor who must establish a local church. Many have even left their businesses or professions in the marketplace thinking that the only way to be in full-time ministry is to be a part of the local church staff or be involved in foreign missions, only to find themselves outside of the will of God. Ministry is bigger than the local church; ministry involves every aspect of our society. There are three basic institutions that God has established where ministry must be carried out: the local church, the family, and the marketplace. Among those institutions, the marketplace is the one where we spend most of our time with the majority of unsaved people. Marketplace ministry challenges those of us who spend much of our time in the marketplace to accept our call into full-time ministry. It challenges us to allow Jesus Christ to change us from fishermen to fishers of men. Many of us who have accepted Christ are still acting as fishermen. We spend most of our time and energy in the marketplace toiling and worrying about how much fish we can catch, not realizing that we are no longer fishermen but fishers of men. As fishers of men, Jesus has now taken the responsibility to ensure that we catch enough fish to make our business profitable, our project successful, or that our campaign for office prevails. Are you a fisherman or a fisher of men? I started my career as an entrepreneurship instructor, executive director, and founder of a nonprofit youth organization. I was doing good works

according to most standards: providing leadership training to young aspiring leaders and helping young people learn the skills of business so they could have an alternative to drugs. But in 1995, through a Christian

businessman who was operating in his marketplace ministry, I received the Lord Jesus Christ as my Savior. That led to a personal transformation where I received my call to use entrepreneurship as a tool to empower the body of Christ and to seek and save the lost. That revelation then led me to develop an entrepreneurship training program called Biblical Entrepreneurship and to restructure the organization my wife and I founded into a service ministry called Nehemiah Project International Ministries. This ministry helps people fulfill God's plan for their lives through business by working with businesses, churches, parachurch ministries, and Christian colleges and universities. At that moment I went from being a fisherman to being a fisher of men. Your transition may not be as drastic; it may not even cause you to change what you are doing. You may only have to change the way you do things and your attitude towards doing them. By the grace of God, the Lord has blessed us to assist hundreds of individuals who are now fulfilling God's plan for their lives in the marketplace. Many are even making money doing so.

Biblical Entrepreneurship is a biblically-based process of identifying opportunities, taking calculated risks, solving problems, and exercising business stewardship for profit. In Biblical Entrepreneurship, the Bible is your guide and everything you do is based on the Word of God. This ensures that you remain in the will of God as you go through the process of using your gifts, skills, and treasures in business. As you identify opportunities, assess these qualities and serve your community by providing goods or services, you must keep your mind focused on the One who has given you those qualities and called you to be in business. Once you have identified your opportunity, you will take calculated risks by counting the cost of taking advantage of the opportunity you have identified. Additionally, you will develop a plan to actualize it. Biblical Entrepreneurship is about solving problems. The opportunity you identify will be a problem encountered by people in your church, community or nation. You, in turn, can find or develop a product or service to solve this problem. As you solve the problems you may encounter, you will be exercising stewardship over a business.

We use the phrase "exercising business stewardship" instead of "owning a business" because the business does not belong to you; it belongs to the Lord. You are only a steward over it. As you exercise business stewardship, you will generate a profit. Whenever you exercise good stewardship over something, a profit is generated.

However, this should not be your sole motivation for going into business. Your primary focus should be to serve people through your products and

Moreover, Biblical Entrepreneurs profit both spiritually and financially because the profit is the result of good stewardship

and obedience to God's Word.

Entrepreneurial success begins with opportunity recognition. Most people spend their time chasing after opportunities, believing that their big hit is just an opportunity away. The problem with this approach is that they often are unprepared for the opportunity they find. They may find themselves lured into the wrong kind of opportunity, which ends up being an opportunity for someone else and a disaster for themselves. In Biblical Entrepreneurship, we believe that opportunities are found in the midst of problems. **Identifying opportunities** is recognizing when the timing of God meets preparation. This principle helps you recognize God's timing for getting into business, starting a particular business, or expanding an existing business. It requires that you know your abilities, and that you cooperate with God in developing them. It also requires that you recognize beneficial gain in the midst of circumstances that may seem less than advantageous. While Joseph was in Egypt, God used various circumstances such as slavery and prison to prepare him for the opportunity that was to come. When his opportunity came, it was disguised as a problem (in this case a famine). Because he was prepared, he was able to provide a solution and to manage the project Pharaoh asked him to manage. Whenever the timing of God meets preparation, an opportunity presents itself. As you believe God for

the right opportunity for you, focus on preparing yourself for it instead of chasing it and, learn how to discern God's will so you will be able to identify it when it comes.
